





PROJECT TITLE: Beyond War Compensation: Gender Justice, Livelihood and Land Rights in Post war Northern Uganda

Funding: The project is funded under by UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) Global Challenges Research Fund (GCRF) - Gender Justice and Security Hub, led by the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE). The GCRF-Gender Justice and Security Hub is composed of four thematic streams i) Transformation and empowerment, ii) Land, livelihoods and rights iii) Migration and displacement and iv) Masculinity and sexuality.

Period: 5-years running from - 13 February 2019 to 12 February 2024.

Goal and Objectives and goals: "Beyond war compensation" project in Acholi Sub-region is under the Land, Livelihoods and Rights stream. The research is examining the existing post-conflict conflicts the dynamics within the rights claims on land from a gendered perspective and the place of women's agency. The study is also documenting existing traditional/customary justice approaches to address post-conflict conflicts. Ultimately the project will propose creative ways of harnessing community oriented approaches, as well as create a critical mass of young people with understanding of transitional justice so as to promote sustainable peace in the region and beyond.

Activities: Key activities include; Field work and Data Collection, Video Production Training & documentary production, Dialogues, Publication & Dissemination Workshops and Summer Schools.
